Mass Intentions at St Timothy Catholic Church

Mass intentions can be scheduled for those who have died, for a birthday, wedding anniversary, for healing, for the conversion of sinners, for the grace to face the challenges in life, for the success in a new job, for those serving in the church and country in different levels, for good weather, bountiful harvest, for world peace, in thanksgiving for the blessings received, etc. We offer the Mass for a specific intention because we believe in the immense spiritual value of the Holy Sacrifice of Mass.

Please read this notice carefully, as the guidelines may have changed

St. Timothy's Parish offers "Announced" and "Unannounced" Masses. In both cases, you may request for a Mass Card.

- An announced mass is printed on the bulletin or publish on the Website the week before it is mentioned in the Church. The intention is read aloud during the designated Mass Day and time. We allow one intention per mass – except for Friday at our 7pm mass and Saturday at our 9am mass, when we may accept up to five intentions. You may also book masses up to a year in advance.
- An unannounced mass is offered at an unspecified date. Your offering is made by the priests when celebrating a mass privately. Since the date of the mass is not specified, the person requesting the mass will not be able to attend.

\$10 for each unannounced mass intention

Offering may be provided in cash or check to St Timothy Catholic Church, at the time of booking or soon after. Please place your offertory in an envelope and marked it as "Mass Intentions-include mass date/time and specific intentions, which you may drop off at the Parish Office OR in the Donation Box available in the entrance of the Church.
