### Mass Intentions at St Timothy Catholic Church

Mass intentions can be scheduled for those who have died, and on birthdays, wedding anniversary, for healing, for the conversion of sinners, for the grace to face the challenges in life, for the success in a new job, for those serving in the church and country in different levels, for good weather, bountiful harvest, for world peace, in thanksgiving for the blessings received, etc. We offer the Mass for a specific intention because we believe in the immense spiritual value of the Holy Sacrifice of Mass.

Please read the following guidelines:

St. Timothy's Parish offers "Announced" and "Unannounced" Masses. In both cases, you may request for a Mass Card.

An **announced mass** is printed in the bulletin or published on the Website the week before it is mentioned in the Church. The intention is read aloud during the designated Mass Day/Time. We allow one intention per mass – except for Friday when we may accept up to 5 intentions. You may also book masses up to a year in advance.

An **unannounced mass** is offered at an unspecified date. Your offering is made by the priests when celebrating a mass privately. Since the date of the mass is not specified, the person requesting the mass will not be able to attend.

Suggested Offertory, payable at booking or soon after:

	\$20 for each announced mass
	\$10 for each unannounced mass

Please place your offertory in an envelope and mark it as "Mass Intentions-include mass date/time and specific intentions which may be drop off at the Parish Office **OR** in the Donation Box available at the back of the Church.
